In 2013 she worked as a social group facilitator at Able Developmental clinic and, in 2016, launched her own behavior consultation group Celebrate Behaviour Innovations, and in 2018, her social skills groups, Spark It!

Crystal loves to work with individuals of all ages, believing that learning and social skill acquisition are a continuous journey. She uses **Applied Behaviour Analysis** (**ABA**) as a science and lens to facilitate meaningful growth in the daily lives of her learners and their families, to enable learners to apply these skills independently in the world.
